OUR GOVERNANCE

The SEDRIC governing body is represented by the SEDRIC Board, currently chaired by Professor Sharon Peacock. The Board is a group of representatives with a diverse range of expertise in the fields of epidemiology, surveillance, genomics, human and animal health.

The Chair and Board members are appointed for a period of two years', renewable for a further two years.

OUR TEAM

The Secretariat is based in the Drug-Resistant Infections Priority Programme at Wellcome. The Secretariat leads and coordinates SEDRIC activities and operations.

4. Provide connectivity with key stakeholders, including the UK Department of Health, WHO, CDC, ECDC and PHE, FAO, OIE, Gates Foundation and National Governments.
5. Attend the annual invitation-only SEDRIC meeting. Attendees will gain a greater knowledge of the wider Drug Resistance Infections and SEDRIC activities, further contribute through thought leadership, and network with other leaders in the field. Participants may take advantage of SEDRIC meetings by becoming a speaker and present their research.
6. Contribute to Board meetings as and when requested.
